THE GREAT DISASTERS IN SOUTH WALES. A NOTIFICATION IN HAMPSHIRE.

FEARED LOSS OF FIFTY-TWO LIVES IN EXPLOSION IN 2 PITS IN HAMPSHIRE. DEADLY AFTERDAMP CAUSES RESCUE OPERATIONS TO BE ABANDONED.

Two colliery disasters—one in South Wales and the other in the Nottinghamshire coalfield—occurred to-day, and in each instance there was a heavy loss of life. Thirty men are entombed in the Marine Colliery, Cwm, Ebbw Vale, where the explosion took place, and rescue operations, which were carried out from the early morning hours until after noon at great peril, have had to be abandoned owing to the presence of after-damp. The explosion occurred one and a half miles from the bottom of the shaft. Fourteen men were killed outright, and the death-roll, it is feared, will reach fifty-two. In the second disaster seventeen men engaged in sinking operations at Bisthorpe Colliery, near Mansfield, were overwhelmed by flooding, and fourteen of them are believed to have been killed either by the falling of a water pipe or by drowning.

HEROES OF THE RESCUE WORK.

Gloom Caused by Stoppage of Operations. The hero of the later rescue work was Dr. O. J. P. Hann, who was the very first to descend the pit. When the men were discovered lying in a hole in the pit seriously injured he immediately rendered them first aid, and administered morphine, and then superintended the removal of the bodies to the surface.
